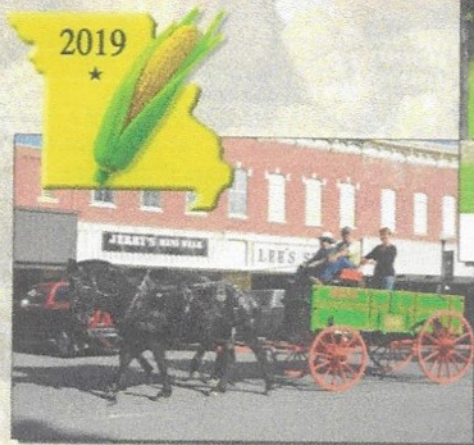

Since the earliest days of settlements in the Midwest, corn has been a vital part of the farm economy. Husking corn by hand is a heritage craft that requires skill and practice to master. Each year contestant teams pit themselves and their horse and mule teams against each other to determine who is the best. We're keeping history alive with this fun and educational competition. Every fifth year, Marshall is privileged to host the National Corn Husking Championships and will be host in 2022.



The Corn Husking Parade is one of the highlights of the event. Bands, tractors, draft horses and wagons, and floats compete for prizes.

The corn husking skill has been passed down through generations.

The antique farm equipment display is at the Saline County Fairground.

Contestants test their skill at the task of husking corn by hand. Men, women, youth and senior citizens compete in their respective class for husking trophies.
